#### Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD)

At Emerton Public School we take pride in providing a positive, differentiated learning environment for our 260+ diverse learners. One strategy we use to cater for all our different styles of learning is to make adjustments to the curriculum. This support is flexible and varies in type of program, amount of assistance, content and length of time through the year. It is based on learning priorities, budgets, resources, emerging needs, new enrolments, etc.

It is mandatory for all schools in Australia (public, private, Catholic, etc.) to provide data about our programs to the Federal Government, including the number of children (not names) who participate. This data is collected by the government through the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD) Program, which occurs annually at the start of August. Our school collects the required data throughout the year through regular monitoring of students' learning and the programs attended by our children. Should you wish to talk to us about NCCD, please contact Mr Smith or Mrs Linas who would be happy to discuss this data collection with you. ## Addition (+) and subtraction (-) mental strategies (doing maths in your head)

We teach children a range of different ways to add and subtract numbers. We want them to look for patterns and use them as much as they can. We want them to have good **number sense** – an understanding of how and why different ways to add and subtract work well.

The goal is for them to be able to do it in their head in a way that makes sense to them.

#### To develop number sense, students learn:

Counting on and counting back	14 + 3 start at 14, then count on to 17 ie 15, 16, 17. 12 – 3 start at 12 then count back to 9, ie 11, 10, 9.
To bridge to 10	Find the nearest 10 eg 17 + 5; 17 and 3 is 20 and add 2 more
To pull numbers apart	5 = 2 + 3 <b>so</b> $8 + 5 = (8 + 2) + 3 = 1324 = 20 + 4$ <b>so</b> $66 + 24 = (66 + 4) + 20 = 90$
Addition facts to 10	0 + 10, 1 + 9, 2 + 8, 3 + 7, 4 + 6, 5 + 5
Doubles	1 + 1, 2 + 2, 3 + 3, 4 + 4
Doubles + 1	1 + 2, 2 + 3, 3 + 4, 4 + 5

# 2017 School Swimming and Water Safety Program

The School Swimming and Water Safety Program is a learn to swim and water safety program that develops water confidence and provides students with basic skills in water safety and survival.

The Program will operate two lessons daily from 1:00-2:30 for 5 consecutive school days at Emerton Leisure Centre. This year our program will run in Term 3 – Week 3 Monday 31<sup>st</sup> July to Friday 4<sup>th</sup> August and is available for all students in Years 2-6. Students will walk to and from the pool each day.

The total cost for the program is \$16:50, which is the pool entry.

It is advised that all students who have not reached a satisfactory level of water safety and survival skills, and are unable to swim 25m confidently unaided in deep water, should participate in the School Swimming and Water Safety Program.

Permission notes were given to all Year 2 to Year 6 students this week. Please return this permission note to the office, with money, no later than Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> July 2017.

The first 60 students to bring in notes and money will be given a place in this worthwhile program.

## **ATSI Stem Camp**

In the last week of Term 2, some of our Year 5 and Year 6 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students attended a Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Camp at Port Hacking for 3 days.

On the first day, students travelled by mini bus (driven by Mr Smith!) to Port Hacking and got settled into their dorm rooms. They then participated in rotating activities for the day, which included building a computer, learning about cultural landscapes and resource management, boomerang throwing and using drones. To finish off the day, students participated in a smoking ceremony and traditional singing and dancing.

Students started the second day at the Royal National Park Environmental Education Centre where they collected specimens and classified them, tested water and temperature and completed a



treasure hunt using a GPS. After that, students travelled by bus into the city and explored the Powerhouse Museum. Here they participated in an astronomy session, a telecommunications session and tried to solve the mystery of Sherlock Holmes. To finish the evening, students had afternoon tea at Government House where they got the chance to meet the Governor General. La'bella was even lucky enough to interview him about his favourite footy team and get his autograph!

On the final day, students rotated through activities where they focussed on digital film, creating a floating shelter and designed an Aboriginal app. After eating lunch and saying goodbye to all of the new friends that were made, Mr Smith picked students up on the bus and took us back to school.
